The Commission was informed that there was a site evaluation completed on June 24, 2021. The Commission was represented by the administrator, Chairman and Peer Reviewer. All present agreed that the flagging was in good shape but there were some additional flags needed added which will need to be delineated prior to the next meeting. There needed to be clarification on some of the buffer zone lines. There was also the evaluation of a stream on site to determine whether it was intermittent or perennial. The applicant will provide updated plans. The goal is to close the hearing at the next meeting.

Consultant Burn from BSC group agreed with the consultant synopsis of the review. There was a screen share of the plan. The consultant explained that sheet numbers C8 and C9 have a significant gap in the wetland line in the field. Flags were added to show where the stream broadens out. There were also details added to the culvert section. There should be more robust delineation near the pond. At the northwest corner of C10 there was found an unmarked small wetland. Another area noted was sheet C9 area near the 700-wetland series at which point flags were added. Sheet C-11 was also referenced. There is an upland area that needed additional bank flagging. There was a question about where the high water connects to the system. The Consultant recommends further review of where the mean high water will be. The Consultant agreed with the delineations.

A revised plan will be done to capture the additional flagging. The applicant was informed that they will have to file with MEPA. There will be a written response the stream stats review. The next step will be to get a set of revised plans. The Commission would like to issue the ORAD at the next meeting.

The Consultant communicated that there were minor items left to address. There was a minor change to basin 11. There was also a change in basin 10 with the 1-foot freeboard. The O & M plan now includes the catch basin drop inlet. It was explained that one of the remaining items are the two retaining walls. This has not been addressed in the comments. The applicant communicated that this will be a typical retaining wall. The plan will be designed and provided to the building department who issues the permit. The applicant indicated that they could work with the client to determine what wall construction and material they think is appropriate for that location. This is all subject to review by the building department. Consultant Di Pietro recommended that there could be a condition that there be provided a stamped design plan subject to the final approval by the building department. The Commission agrees that this could be a special condition as part of the Order of Conditions.

The Commission recapped the site inspection which was competed with the applicant representatives. The visit focused on six areas. The applicant provided a screen share. The applicant communicated that there is no impact within the 100-foot inner riparian area. The vernal pool on east side will be restored. This vernal pool was destroyed by ATV's. There will be a path to access this area. The peer review will provide a written narrative on how to restore this vernal pool. There were detailed notes included on the replication area. It was recommended to do a quick inventory to know what is in the field of the proposed replication area. There was discussion about the second crossing. There will require about 16 ft. of fill to be brought in. The Chairman would like to have possible alternatives in the types of material used. There was a concern about the infiltration basin #7 and possible ledge in this area. It was suggested to do more test pits in this area. The applicant communicated that this will be a retention basin only. The Commission was informed that the Planning Board will be considering a draft decision for the August 12, 2021 meeting.

It was recommended to continue this hearing to August 11, 2021 at 8:00 pm.

The applicant's wetland scientist confirmed there were no wetlands in this area. The applicant would like to set up a site walk with the commission on Saturday July 10, 2021 at 8:30 pm.
