Hands-Free Electronic Device Law

The "hands-free" law takes effect in Massachusetts on February 23, 2020. This law (Chapter 122 of the Acts of 2019) prohibits operators of motor vehicles from using any mobile electronic device, including a cell phone, unless the device is used in hands-free mode.

Penalties and Offense Codes for Hands-Free Law Violations

The following chart shows the penalties for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd and subsequent offenses of the hands-free law and the codes that must be entered. For an e-citation, select the proper code from the dropdown menu. For a hand-written citation, make sure to include both the letter (A, B, or C) and the offense number. For a warning, make sure to select warning.

| Offense Number | Penalty | Offense Code |
|-----------------------------------|---|--|
| 1st offense | \$100 fine | 90/13B/A - ELECTRONIC DEVICE, USE WHILE OPERATING MV, 1ST OFFENSE* c90 §13B |
| 2nd offense | \$250 fine, plus mandatory completion of a distracted driving educational program | 90/13B/B - ELECTRONIC DEVICE, USE WHILE OPERATING MV, 2ND OFFENSE* c90 §13B |
| 3rd and subsequent offenses | \$500 fine, plus insurance surcharge and mandatory completion of distracted driving educational program | 90/13B/C - ELECTRONIC DEVICE, USE WHILE OPERATING MV, 3RD OR SUBSQ OFFENSE* c90 §13B |

Driver History Records

In state, Massachusetts hands-free violations will appear on the CJIS driver history as:

ELECTRONIC DEVICE, USE WHILE OPERATING MV

The offense number (1ST, 2ND, 3RD, etc) will not be included in the driver history information returned in CJIS. The disposition information will follow the violation line. A 'WRN' will notate that a warning has been issued for this operator for this violation.

Out of state hands-free violations will appear as follows and will include the state abbreviation after the violation. Below is a sample of a New York conviction for this violation using the AAMVA Code Dictionary of M86:

M86 - HH PHONE WHILE DRIVING - NY

The following will appear on a driver history record for an operator who is required to take the Distracted Driving Education Program. This is a \$25 online course that can be taken at any time. The incident date listed in CJIS with the non-renew is the date that the non-renewal will take effect should the operator fail to complete the course within 90 days of a finding of responsibility for a second offense.

NON RENEW: M86 - HH PHONE WHILE DRIVING

Note: For the purpose of determining the number of offenses when writing your citation, review the entirety of the driver history for responsible findings that have been issued for hands-free violations after 2/23/20.

Drivers 18 and Over

Drivers 18 and over can only use mobile electronic devices in hands-free mode. In addition, they:

- Are only permitted to touch devices/phones to activate hands-free mode
- Are not permitted to hold or support any device/phone
- Cannot touch device/phone except to activate the hands-free mode and can only enable when it is installed or properly mounted to the windshield, dashboard, or center console in a manner that does not impede the operation of the motor vehicle
- Are not allowed to touch device/phone for texting, emailing, apps, video, or internet use
- Are permitted to activate GPS navigation when the device/phone is installed or properly mounted

Under this new law, handheld use is allowed only if the vehicle is both stationary and not located in a public travel lane; it is not allowed at red lights or stop signs.

Voice to text and communication to electronic devices is legal only when the device/phone is properly mounted; use of headphone (one ear) is permitted.

Drivers Under 18

Drivers under 18 **are not allowed** to use any electronic devices. All device/phone use while driving is illegal, including use in hands-free mode.

Reporting Emergencies

Operators may use a cell phone to call 911 to report an emergency. If possible, the operator should safely pull over and stop before calling 911.
