Emergency Applicants must attach or submit proof of homelessness.

All applicants must fully document the following:

- 1. Without or about to be without a place to live; and
- 2. Life or safety threatening situation; and
- 3. Made reasonable efforts to locate alternative housing; and
- 4. Housing search verification attached

C. Abusive situation

- 5. Applicant did not contribute to circumstances; and
- 6. Applicant has tried to prevent the life threatening situation.

Acceptable verification includes letters from social workers, shelters, social service agencies, or code enforcement agencies that confirm that you meet the definition of "Homeless Applicant".

	B. Severe Medical Emergency
