A smile, a friendly face and 'Hi, how are you doing?' works wonders! Volunteering makes me very happy and gives me purpose. It feels like I make a difference."

"What we would like to express to all of you," said Dutil from center stage, "is a deep-seated appreciation for the abundance of your service. We have done great things together and I sit in excited anticipation of all that we will continue to do in the future."

"I alone cannot change the world, but I can cast a stone across the waters to create many ripples." — Mother Theresa

After 30 years of dreaming about it, I had the opportunity to take my scuba diving certification. To my total dismay, I realized that the idyllic surface was not so under the water. The 1.3 °F increase since the late 19th century due to the excessive carbon dioxide we are producing is dangerously stressing coral reefs worldwide, causing them to lose algae living there, bleaching the corals, and eventually killing them (National Oceanic & Atmospheric Administration).

Outraged by the industries causing greenhouse gases and global warming, I controlled my self-righteous urge to drown my charming diving partner, who coincidentally was a proud member of the oil industry in North America. Refreshed by the beautiful view on the surface and the possibility of a margarita, I calmly reflected and researched my possible contribution to the pitiful state of our planet.

According to the Nature Conservancy, the average carbon footprint for a person in the US is about 16 tons, one of the highest rates in the world. Globally, the average carbon footprint is closer to four tons (2013). That means 1.5 years of emissions weigh as much as the Statue of Liberty. To curb a lethal 2-degree rise in global temperatures, the average global carbon footprint per year needs to drop to under 2 tons by 2050 (The Nature Conservancy, 2013).

During the last couple of years, we heard from environmental NGOs, multilateral organizations, and lately from the public sector about the individual and collective strategies that can save every form of life on the planet. Why are we so slow to adopt and sustain some of those tactics? Why do they seem so burdensome? Is there a way to wake up from our selfish slumber before it is too late for all of us? What is our role now?

The more I think about it, the more convinced I am about **the immense opportunity for senior citizens to take a role as primary stewards of our environment.** Considering the growing trends within the population aged 65 and over in the USA, projected to reach 22% by 2050 (Census Bureau, 2014), we hold now, and even more so in a couple of years, a massive power determining the political agenda in Washington.

I have observed the state of hopelessness we can fall into after retirement. **Wouldn't promoting, restoring, and protecting our natural world and its living wonders bring a renewed and less self-centered meaning to our lives?** We think that when we reach around 50 years of age that we are an insignificant grain of salt, but as such, and together, we are deeply consequential. We are inter-connected to other beings, and our actions resonate with every living being on this planet. Each living being has an infinite value. **Now is our time to act;** it is our moral responsibility. Without us, our planet will lose its voice, beauty, and life as we know it.

The Russian dictator ("Mad Vlad") will be the subject of Henry Quinlan's presentation at the Senior Center on June 17 at 1pm.

Between 1986 and 2018, Quinlan made more than 60 trips to the former Soviet Union and Russia. He owns a publishing company based in Massachusetts and has done business in Russia.

His presentation on Putin has been given 28 times this year. Feedback includes: "Remarkable!" "I see that Putin has two sides." "Very clear and succinct."

Quinlan writes: "The war is a tragedy but for

now, Putin remains popular. There is a discussion of what could topple Putin. There is an examination of the policies and actions that could lead to a new "Cold War." Who would believe that Russia could be the leading food producer in the world in the future? But that is



a real possibility. It is one of the results of Putin's competence."
