Re: Request for approval of amendment to Zoning By-Laws

Bellingham Town Clerk

Gentlemen:

I hereby certify that the following amendment to the Zoning By-Laws of the Town of Bellingham was adopted at the Special Town Meeting held Dec. 3, 1969, under Article 7 of the Warrant:

Voted: That the Town amend the Zoning By-Laws as follows:

(A) Amend ARTICLE IV Definitions by inserting the following at its proper alphabetic location: Camping, Commercial. Premises used for campers tenting, or temporary overnight facilities of any kind, operated seasonally, where a fee is charged.

(B) Amend section 2400, use regulation schedule, by inserting a new row immediately below "campers, supervised" to read as follows:

CAMPING COMMERCIAL

A R M B I Sp. No No No No

The vote on the above was as follows:

YES 96; NO 2

ABSTAINING 6

TOTAL 104

2/3 of 98 being 66, the motion carried.

I further certify as follows:
